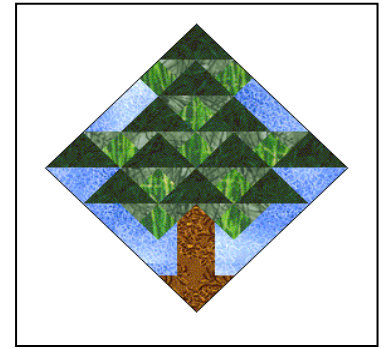

Lecture and workshop with Kimberly Enema. Get an early Mother's day present and come to the workshop!

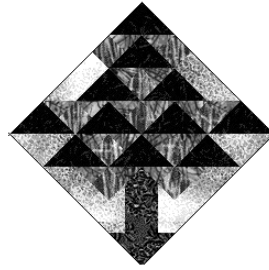
Homework for the January 6 meeting:
