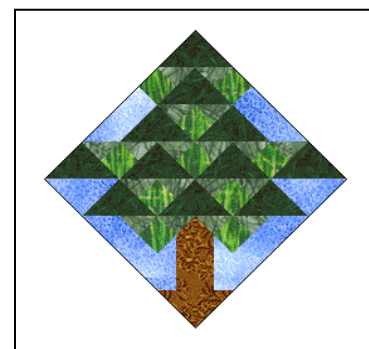

RETREAT: The retreat is this weekend. Jeff is going, beware.

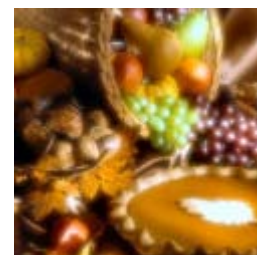
NOMINATING: Nothing to report.

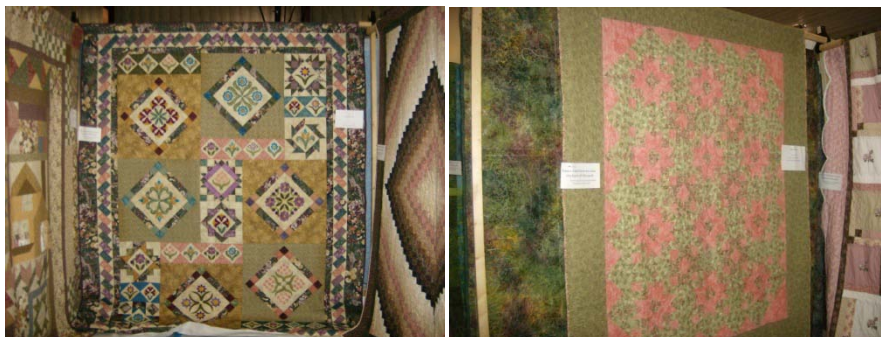
