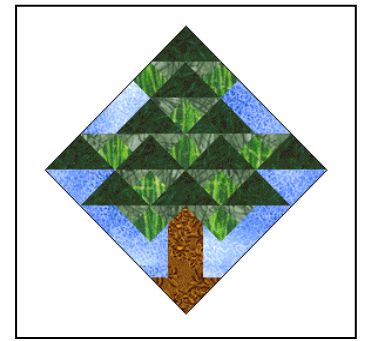

Each entry will get a number and you will vote on the number you like. We will have 1st, 2nd, 3rd prize. The prize this year will be vendor cash. It will be awarded Friday night at the show & you will be photographed with your quilt to be on our website. 1st place - \$25, 2nd place \$15, 3rd place \$10.

The guild voted on the entries and the first place winner was Sharon Weixel, 2nd place winner was Jeff Randall, 3rd place was Vickie Hoover. Prizes will be vendor cash. There were many beautiful entries.

Bring canned and/or dry goods for donation to the food bank for Thanksgiving.

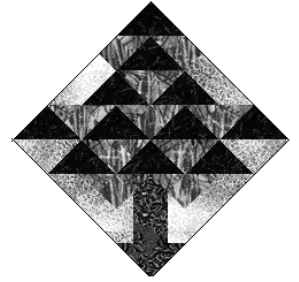
Bring either 4 fat quarters or ten 2-1/2" strips. You'll receive betting chips for your donations. Then place your bets and win chances to take home some new fabric!
